- Provides educationally necessary intervention in the area of motor skill development, focusing primarily on fine motor and sensorimotor development, under the general supervision of a licensed Occupational Therapist
- Services are provided in a variety of school settings, ranging from preschool to high school. Performs related work as required
- Ability to drive to various schools in order to provide occupational therapy services in the neighborhood schools of students on caseload
- Display ability to work collaboratively with others on a team
- Perform other tasks, duties, or services consistent with this position as assigned

Skills and Abilities Required: The following characteristics and physical skills are important for the successful performance of assigned duties.

- The work is mostly walking and standing with periods of sitting
- Typical positions require workers to lift up to 100 pounds, climb stairs, ladders or scaffolding
- Bend and crouch
- Reach, hold, grasp and turn objects
- Use fingers to operate computer or typewriter keyboards
- Demonstrate an athletic activity or physical exercise
- Feel the shape, size and temperature of objects
- Physically restrain students
- The work requires the ability to speak normally, to use normal or aided vision or hearing and to detect odors

Supervisory Responsibilities:

Working Conditions: Exposure to the following situations may range from remote to frequent based on circumstances and factors that may not be predictable.

- Frequent periods of walking and standing with periods of sitting
- Typically require workers to lift up to 100 pounds, climb stairs, ladders or scaffolding
- Reach, hold, grasp and turn objects
- Ability to physically restrain students safely
- Frequent use of electronic mail and personal computer
- Accidents improbable outside of minor injuries, such as cuts, scrapes, or bruises
- No exposure to chemical or health hazards but limited exposure to odors
- Primarily require working indoors in environmentally controlled conditions
